Current and Pending Support Table – National Science Foundation (NSF)

September 22, 2020

The purpose of this document is to guide COGR member institutions in meeting the disclosure requirements under NSF's Proposal & Award Policies and Procedures Guide (PAPPG effective June 1, 2020). Note: NSF notified the community that it would extend the June 1, 2020, mandatory requirement to use the two NSF-approved formats for submission of the biographical sketch and Current and Pending Support to October 5, 2020 for new applications submitted or due on or after October 5, 2020.

Overarching Message from NSF: Current and pending support disclosures are required for each individual designated as senior personnel in order for NSF to 1) assess the capacity of awardees to carry-out the research as proposed and 2) help assess any overlap/duplication with the project being proposed. Current and pending support includes *all resources* made available to an individual in support of and/or related to all of his/her research efforts, regardless of whether or not they have monetary value.

NSF recognizes that the number of person months associated with the time commitments of activities reported in current and pending support has a different basis in scale and scope from the number of person months used to estimate personnel salary costs in an NSF proposal budget. The number of person months between these forms need not and often do not equal. (See [FAQ#3](#)). The number of person months for current and pending support is based on the start and end dates of the activity. The purpose, instructions and requirements of these proposal forms differ greatly. Current and pending is based on an individual's research activities that have a time commitment, whether or not paid by their institution. Therefore, it can include reporting of activities that are broader than the normal work activities defined by the institution and included in the institutional base salary (cost reimbursement for work activities performed).

The content below, including Table 1.0, is intended to provide a quick synopsis of what *is* and *is not* required to be reported as C&P support per the [NSF PAPPG](#) and the [NSF FAQs](#) updated on July 30, 2020.

Does NOT Require Reporting:

- Gifts -no associated time commitment (See [FAQ#2](#))
- In kind contributions not intended for use on the project/proposal being proposed to NSF

- that have no associated time commitment (See [FAQ #4](#))
- Proposing organization start up packages (See [FAQ #6](#))
 - Mentoring activities that take place as part of the regular appointment at the proposing organization (See [FAQ #10](#))
 - Independent research endeavors of an individual in the lab other than the person filling out the C&P support form (See [FAQ #11](#))
 - Postdoctoral fellows and Graduate students who are personally funded on fellowships by foundations. (See [FAQ#14](#))
 - Consulting or Professional Services where no research is being performed (See [FAQ #15](#))
 - Faculty Academic Year Salary (See [FAQ #6](#))
