Reference OMB Uniform Guidance 2 CFR 200.330 (also 200.93 and 200.23)

In the performance of research and sponsored programs, Lehigh University may wish to collaborate with other organizations in order to obtain services or materials, perform tasks, or achieve objectives. Principal Investigators may wish to enter into agreements with such organizations either during the proposal stage or after receiving a Federal award. The relationship of the collaborating organization to the fulfillment of the need is crucial to determining the form of procurement, the awarding of funds, and the responsibilities with regard to compliance.

## Definitions:

- **Subaward/subrecipient**: A subaward relationship is created for the purpose of carrying out a portion of the project and creates a Federal assistance relationship with the subrecipient, with scholarly or scientific responsibilities. Does not include an individual that is a beneficiary of such program.
- **Vendor/Contractor/Professional Service**: A contract, agreement, and/or purchase order is created for the purpose of obtaining goods and services for Lehigh's own use or use of the beneficiaries of the program, and creates a procurement/vendor relationship with a company, merchant, or other seller providing goods or services.
